Join our walkers and Remember together

VETERANS are embarking on a 50-mile Walk of Remembrance across Rossendale and are appealing for people to join them.

Last year intrepid Pioneer Corps veteran Phil Speddy and Royal Signals veteran Bob Brindley, completed a week-long walk when they visited more than 60 memorials, playing the Last Post and observing a silence at each.

This year, the walk will be from November 3 to 5 with a special visit to three Remembrance Sunday ceremonies on November 9.

They are also appealing for people to join them on sections of the walk, perhaps to a location that has special significance, or just to join in the act of Remembrance.

Chief Executive Amanda Walton joined Bob and Phil for a small section of the walk last year.

She said: "Last year I was not well, but I managed to do a part of the walk with them, not as much as I had wanted to do, but all I could do.

"It is really important to show respect for the fallen of Rossendale.

"For me, taking part in the walk was very humbling, very emotional and I likened it to how we all felt from VIC when we visited France in September.

"It makes you stop, think and reflect and remember a different era, a different generation. These people fought for us and our future."

Bob and Phil, who is now the Operations Manager of VIC, also completed a 264mile bike ride in the summer from London to Haslingden.

Bob added: "It is an honour to lead this year's walk, I know what this means to our veterans, and to Rossendale."

> Phil said: "This isn't just a walk - it is Remembrance in motion."

The walk will also be raising money to support the work of the charity and everyone

who joins is asked to donate or be sponsored.

raise funds for VIC.


More than £250 has already been raised and tickets cost £2. The draw will close on Remembrance Day Tuesday November 11 at 11am when the winning number will be selected.

In April 1917, while he was serving with the 9th Battalion, The Suffolk Regiment, he fell at the Battle of Arras. Although he was remembered on the Arras Memorial, his remains were seemingly lost forever. However, de-mining works for a new hospital and Lens led to remains being discovered in 2020 and DNA tests confirmed his identity.

Fred was buried today in the Commonwealth War Graves Commission Loos British Cemetery in the presence of his family.

WHEN veterans are in crisis, it is important VIC is able to respond quickly by bringing together different agencies to help the individual.

Recently we were made aware of a veteran who was homeless and a second who was in immediate risk of being made homeless.

Chief Executive
Amanda Walton said:
"Project Worker Ray
Sharkey was made
aware of the situation
and did a lot of
intensive work with the

veterans to rehome them.

"This was with Myshon Housing in Accrington

and they both viewed flats on the same day with one moving in on the Friday and the other on the Monday.

"The support for them both is still ongoing and they have formed a friendship."

VIC does not work

in isolation and involves other agencies where appropriate to provide

the best support to meet each veteran's individual need.

The charity has been donated food and toiletries to

make up 12 packs for veterans in immediate need. VIC donated two to the veterans who needed a home, so they had food and essentials when they moved in.

Amanda said: "We are very grateful to the anonymous benefactor who donated these items to VIC. It will make a real difference to the lives of so many when they need the help most."

One of the veterans who was rehomed is becoming more active with VIC and attended a Mental Health First Aid Training course at the VIC Centre for staff, invited members and beneficiaries.

The course was delivered by Richard Hodgins of Manchester HQ CIC.

Geared up to go

Call for action on memorial site

VIC is joining forces with businesses and community groups to ensure the Huncoat War Memorial is improved.

In 2014, Hyndburn Borough Council proposed relocating the memorial from Huncoat Recreation Ground to improve accessibility.

The proposal sparked outcry and a 'Don't Move the Cross' campaign was formed. In 2015, a formal consultation found only 5.2 per cent of residents supported the idea but the memorial still needs remedial work, as does the steep and uneven ground around it.

VIC has joined the local community to call for work to be carried out on the Grade II Listed monument to make it safe for all to access.

The memorial was entirely paid for by public subscription and was unveiled in 1922.

VETERANS revved up for a good time at the latest visit to Mission Motorsport's Brews and Banter at the Three Sisters Circuit in Wigan.

This time, the VIC team joined forces with Burnley FC in the Community's Veterans' Project.

The scheme works because the car owners provide vehicles and drivers to give the veterans a taste of life in the fast lane.

One, Matthew Everatt, even came along on his birthday with his Team Hadfield Motorsport Puma. He said: "Giving veterans a few high-speed laps isn't just fun; it's a way to safely reconnect with that sense of focus and energy they once knew so well."

The veterans loved the speed of the course, obviously the banter and laughs and one member also kindly paid for refreshments for all.

A GROUNDBREAK-ING project that benefits older horses and helps nurture veterans, has the potential to revolutionise scent-seeking searches.

The work being pioneered at Adventure Neighground Livery, at Spring Vale Farm. Green Haworth, Accrington, was outlined to VIP guests the Lord Lieutenant of Lancashire Amanda Parker JP, and Deputy Lieutenants Cosima Towneley and Caroline Wareing.

Owner Kathryn
Williams welcomed the
VIP guests and, despite
the very wet weather,
was able to give a
demonstration of the
work the horses
undertake.

She said: "This has been led and decided by the veterans who come here. We want to build a sustainable community.

"This is a partnership and, as we bring in more people, they will they will take ownership of their pathway, gaining confidence and independence."

The Lord Lieutenant praised how the project benefited all, not just

the scent work, but the relationship between the horses and the veterans and the importance of veterans having a place to come where they have social engagement.

The idea of using horses to scent search came from Veterans In Communities member Royal Signal veteran Bob Brindley who had been on a course at the farm.

He had also been a member of Rossendale and Pendle Mountain Rescue Team where he used to work with scent dogs and he suggested to Kathryn that those training methods may work with the horses.

The programme

works on a reward basis and sees horses detecting scent, following trails and finding objects.


George, owned by Maria Hurley, is liveried at Neighground and demonstrated how he could find specific objects in a large field by putting his nose to the ground and sniffing them out. He was also able to reject an item that did not have the scent.

Then Household Cavalry veteran Sam Cooper showed how another older horse Dylan could find coffeesoaked sponges on a large menage by following the scent.

Sam said: "I had

never seen anything like it in my life. Being with horses is my happy place, doing scent work takes me away from family and home stress and I can relax. I wanted to be a part of this; it's brilliant."

Sam and Royal Signals veteran Neil



McKavett, have gone on to help Kathryn deliver courses including teaching veterinary students.

VIC Chief Executive Amanda Walton, Operations Manager Phil Speddy and Project Worker Ray Sharkey also attended.

Amanda Walton said:
"We can see the
difference the project
has made to Sam. VIC
is about offering people
different activities and
this is a great
partnership."

After seeing the project in action, Deputy Lieutenant Caroline said: "I was skeptical before I came but now I

have seen it, it has been interesting and it is nice to see the horses learning new skills.

"The weather has been awful because of the wind and the rain but that makes what we have seen even more impressive given the conditions. It will be interesting to see how far they can go and where they can take it."

the horses and asked
about whether horses
could be used to assist
in searching terrain that
was not suitable for
dogs.

Bob replied: "We never say never. Years ago, we wouldn't use a search dog."
